Features of the Ageing Parallel Sessions

Feature 1 - Keynote Lecture(s)

- Having another speaker from the Swedish side may be considered

Feature 2 - Workshops (Panel Sessions) and Paper Presentations

- Workshop(s) on registries and longitudinal studies
- Paper Presentations on topics related to ageing. Young researchers are especially welcome to participate, and the CFP will be made available by the summer

<u>Feature 3</u> – Opportunities for Young and Early Career Researchers

 Ageing TEG welcomes young and early career researchers (including students and postdocs) to join any of our sessions.

 - A short session where the participants can experiment with recreational activities adopted at Japanese elderly care institutions
